Sit to stand 'three peaks' challenge Wychbury Hill Stourbridge



Straddling the border of Stourbridge and Worcestershire, Wychbury Hill forms part of the Clent Hills group.

It has a long and interesting history, being home to the Wychbury Ring, an iron age hill fort, a Pagan Yew avenue, and the Wychbury Obelisk. From the top there are good views across the Severn Valley as far as the Malvern Hills, Habberley Hill and the Clee Hills.

The Obelisk displays graffiti, added in 1993, asking "Who put Bella in the Wych Elm?" On 18 April 1943, four local boys poaching in nearby Hagley Woods discovered a skull in a hollowed-out tree trunk. The identity of the victim has remained a mystery ever since, with various theories centred around a German spy ring.
